## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **1. City Prosecutor Agreement:**

Public Safety Director, Gordon Fell, reviewed this item with the council. Joy Williams took over the position of Mulvane City Prosecutor in October 2020. The current contract expires January 5, 2026. The only change to the renewal contract is the dates associated with the contract and the monthly amount of compensation. The 2026 contract shall be \$2,500 per month with any additional services compensated at the rate of \$200.00 per hour. The 2026 contract will expire January 4, 2027.

MOTION by Leeds, second by Leach to approve the contract with Joy K. Williams.  
MOTION approved unanimously.

### **2. RSVP Agreement with Sedgwick County:**

Senior Center Director, Kaylie Mistretta, reviewed this item with the council. The Mulvane Senior Center utilizes the Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) to provide transportation services for seniors. The City originally signed an agreement with the Sedgwick County Department on Aging in October 2015 and has renewed the agreement each year. All compensation provided under this Agreement is on a fee-for-service basis, which is seven dollars (\$7.00) per coordinated ride not to exceed \$2,000 per year.

MOTION Huntley, second by Westfall to approve the Volunteer Transportation Agreement between the City of Mulvane, Kansas and Sedgwick County, Kansas for providing transportation services pursuant to the RSVP Transportation Program.  
MOTION approved unanimously.

### **3. Authorizing Resolution for PMIB Loan:**

City Attorney, J.T. Klaus, reviewed this item with the council. Since 2012 the Kansas Star Casino has appealed the valuation of its real property to the State Board of Tax Appeals (BOTA). The appeals have caused the valuation of the Kansas Star to fluctuate significantly, resulting in retroactive valuation reductions whereby the City must pay back the amount of property tax collected that exceeded the tax on the adjusted valuation.

In 2023, the County indicated a global settlement of Tax Refund amounts owed for all outstanding appeals and an agreed upon valuation for the year 2023, as well as the method for valuation for the next 5 years.

The Sumner County Treasurer will withhold the 2020 Tax Refund of \$1,141,675.50 from the City's January 2026 property tax distribution and withhold the 2021 Tax Refund of \$1,331,709.30

from the City's June 2026 property tax distribution. The tax distribution withholdings will reduce the City's 2026 tax revenue by \$2,473,384.80, which will impact the tax levying funds of the City.

Staff recommends pursuing the PMIB loan under K.S.A. 79-2005(n) for the 2020 Tax Refund at this time for the January affected tax distribution, and to pursue an additional PMIB loan for the 2021 Tax Refund at the time of the June withholding. The City Attorney has drafted the proposed Resolution necessary for both the January and June withholdings.

MOTION by Huntley, second by Gerber to pass Resolution 2026-1 authorizing the Mayor to apply for a loan from the Pooled Money Investment Board through the Sumner County Treasurer to cover the January 2026 and June 2026 tax distribution withholdings, pursuant to K.S.A. 79-2005(n).

MOTION approved unanimously.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 2026-1

A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF MULVANE, KANSAS TO REQUEST ONE OR MORE LOANS FROM THE POOLED MONEY INVESTMENT BOARD PURSUANT TO K.S.A. 79-2005 AS A RESULT OF CERTAIN TAX REFUND AND REDUCTIONS ORDERED TO BE PAID TO THE KANSAS STAR CASINO.

#### ENGINEER

##### **1. Project Review and Update:**

Main "A" Sanitary Sewer Improvements Phase 3 – The City is reviewing a plan to construct a reinforced concrete valley gutter in 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave. on the north side of Mulvane St. This will be warranty work on the full-width replacement of 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave. pavement.

Main "A" Sanitary Sewer Improvements Phase 4 – Approx. 2,265 LF of sanitary sewer line has been completed and tested, including the boring and steel encasement under K-15. Some site clearing has been completed north of K-15, and some site restoration has been completed in Ralph Bell Park.

English Park Pedestrian Bridge – The Contractor has completed site grading for the bridge including adjacent storm sewer inlet and pipe.

Water Distribution System Study – A preliminary draft of the study has been completed and sent to City Staff.

## **LAND BANK**

City Attorney, J.T. Klaus, reviewed the Notice of Agreement and Right of First Refusal with the Board. In January of 2018, the Mulvane Land Bank entered into a purchase agreement with Ron Keller (Five For a Dollar, LLC) for the property at 202 W. Main. Pursuant to the Special Warranty Deed dated February 21, 2018, the Land Bank was provided a Right of First Refusal with respect to the property if at any time the owner receives an offer to sell, lease, or otherwise transfer the property. Ben Gartner, Broker at J.P. Weigand and Sons, Inc. provided notice to the City of Mr. Kellers (FFD) intent to sell the property to Ryan Gould and Emily Sippel.

The Land Bank can purchase the property for the same purchase price as the offer (\$109,344.33) or may consent to the Proposed Transfer which includes the consent to the transfer and preserves the Land Bank's Right of First Refusal for subsequent transfers of the Property.

MOTION by Leeds, second by Leach to approve the Notice of Agreement and Right of First Refusal and authorize the Chair to execute the same.

MOTION approved unanimously.

MOTION by Huntley, second by Westfall to adjourn the meeting of the Mulvane Land Bank Board of Trustees and reconvene as the Mulvane City Council.

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**Background:**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 14-204, as chartered from with substitute provisions by the City of Mulvane, Kansas (the “City”) and as set forth in the Code of Mulvane, Kansas, the City Council shall elect from its membership a President of the Council. Attached is a list of past Presidents of the Council. Historically, it appears the City Council has rotated the position between Council Members.

**Analysis:**

The President of the Council presides at the City Council meeting in the absence of the Mayor, but still retains his or her voting rights. The President votes as a regular Council Member and does not cast any tie-breaking votes as in the case of the Mayor, even in the Mayor’s absence. The President does not assume the Mayor’s right of Veto, nor can the President of the Council typically sign an Ordinance when presiding (this right is reserved to the Mayor). Nonetheless, in the event of a permanent vacancy in the office of Mayor, the President of the Council does automatically become the Mayor and the City Council then simply appoints a replacement Council Member. Each year, the City Council has elected a President from its membership. It is appropriate to hold such an election following any City Council election.

**Legal Considerations:**

The legal process for electing a President of the Council is by simple motion approved by a majority of the Council. There is no formula or necessary consideration for the decision.

**Financial Considerations:**

The President of the Council gets the same \$50 per meeting as the rest of the Council Members.

I respectfully submit this request to be placed on the agenda for the next regularly scheduled City Council meeting.

I am requesting the opportunity to address permitting, inspection, and enforcement matters in two related areas of concern:

1. Creek-adjacent permitting and environmental oversight, including inspection procedures, documentation, interdepartmental communication, and enforcement when potential hazards or violations are reported.
2. Residential permitting and inspection issues related to my property, including inspection follow-through, corrective action requirements, and enforcement processes when deficiencies are identified.

These items raise broader questions regarding process consistency, accountability, and public safety. My intent is to seek clarity regarding existing policies and procedures, identify potential gaps in implementation, and discuss constructive solutions to improve oversight and enforcement moving forward.

I believe this discussion is in the public interest and will contribute to improved transparency, environmental stewardship, and resident safety.

Thank you for placing me on the agenda for the January 21st City Council meeting. As requested, I am providing a concise narrative summary for inclusion in the City Council packet.

I am sharing this not to assign fault, but to explain how the current permitting, inspection, and enforcement system is functioning in practice, and how gaps in accountability continue to affect residents particularly tenants.

My concerns began at my residence at 120 W. Blair Street. According to written communication from the Metropolitan Area Building and Construction Department (MABCD), final inspections were attempted on July 11, 2025, and again on November 2, 2025, but were not approved due to outstanding corrections. However, my records indicate that a final Certificate of Occupancy was issued on July 11, 2025. In addition, the natural gas meter was not installed until October 2025. As a resident, this raises reasonable questions about how final occupancy approval was determined and how unresolved inspection items are tracked and enforced once a home is occupied.

As I continued asking questions, it became clear this issue is not isolated. MABCD documented that the property at 517 N. Elizabeth failed a final inspection on November 7, 2024, after which the permit went void and no further inspections were scheduled. Despite this, the property has reportedly remained occupied for approximately the past year. This suggests a broader gap in how occupied properties with failed or void permits are identified and addressed.

I also reported construction debris, potential wastewater concerns, and erosion near the creek behind my home to both the City and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE). KDHE conducted a site visit, documented debris and concrete rubble in and along the creek, and confirmed my concerns were appropriate to report. While KDHE did not find an immediate downstream water quality threat, their review was limited to water quality and did not address local permitting, site alterations, or erosion control responsibilities.

Throughout this process, I have experienced the accountability gap tenants face ,yet I am the one living with the consequences of unresolved issues. Responsibility has frequently been redirected between owners, contractors, MABCD, and the City, with no clear enforcement owner or timeline. As of today, these issues remain ongoing, and I continue to bear the impacts as a tenant.

I am asking the City Council to consider whether current policies adequately protect residents and whether clearer City-owned accountability, improved tracking of failed or void permits, and a more accessible process for tenants could help prevent situations like this from continuing.

**GOVERNMENT SERVICE AGREEMENT  
FOR CODE INSPECTION AND ENFORCEMENT OF  
BUILDING, ELECTRICAL, MECHANICAL AND PLUMBING CODES  
BY SEDGWICK COUNTY IN THE CITY OF MULVANE, KANSAS**

14<sup>th</sup> THIS GOVERNMENT SERVICE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into this day of November, 2016, by and between the City of Mulvane, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as "City," and the Board of County Commissioners of Sedgwick County, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as "County."

**WHEREAS**, the City and the County are desirous of providing the best possible code inspection and enforcement to the citizens of the City and its environs; including code inspections and enforcement based upon standardized building, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical codes; and

**WHEREAS**, the County currently provides code inspection and enforcement in the unincorporated area of Sedgwick County through the Metropolitan Area Building and Construction Department ("MABCD"—a joint code enforcement department between the County and the City of Wichita, Kansas) pursuant to the Wichita-Sedgwick County Unified Building and Trade Code ("UBTC"); and

**WHEREAS**, the City has requested County, through the MABCD, to provide code inspection within the corporate boundaries of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, City and County are authorized to enter into an agreement for such services pursuant to K.S.A. 12-2908, and such agreement shall not be regarded as an interlocal agreement under the provisions of K.S.A. 12-2901, *et seq.*; and

**WHEREAS**, the City and the County are desirous of providing the citizens of the City with code inspection services based upon the UBTC's provisions, as amended, which include building, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical codes, and meet the needs of the City for the protection of public health, safety, and welfare, with qualified code inspection personnel.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants recited herein, the parties do agree as follows:

1. **Scope.** The County, through the MABCD, shall provide code inspection services to the City, based upon the UBTC, as amended, which includes building, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical codes.
2. **Expenses.** All expenses necessary to the operation of the inspections shall be paid and provided for by the MABCD.
3. **Inspections and Permits; Receipt of Fees; Payments.** The City shall pay to the County fifty percent (50%) of all monies received for inspections, permits, and other fees charged in the UBTC that are not otherwise addressed within either this paragraph or Paragraph 4. The County shall receive one hundred percent (100%) of plan review fees for plans reviewed by the County. The fees that are to be charged are included within the UBTC and such fees shall also apply within the City. The County shall keep the City punctually advised of said rates. Payment shall be made by the

City to the County on a monthly basis by City check or warrant, along with details regarding the corresponding permits for such fees.

4. **Licensing.** Licensing and compliance therewith for any licenses applied for after this Agreement is entered into shall be the sole responsibility of the County (through the MABCD for licenses that cover the entire MABCD jurisdiction) and the County shall receive one hundred percent (100%) of all licensing fees. The County will honor any City licenses that are valid at the time this Agreement is entered into for the remaining terms of said licenses, solely for work completed within the City. The City's existing authorized building licenses expire on December 31, 2016, and the existing authorized plumbing, mechanical and electrical licenses expire on December 31, 2017. Any parties that apply for licensure or to renew their licensure after this Agreement is entered into shall be required to obtain a licensure through the MABCD pursuant to the terms of the UBTC.

5. **Consent by City.** By entering into this Agreement, the governing body of the City has consented to the County exercising local legislation and administration, including the application of the UBTC within the corporate limits of the City located in Sedgwick County, such that this Agreement does not infringe upon the City's home rule powers, pursuant to K.S.A. 19-101a(4).

6. **Adoption of UBTC.** The City's governing body has taken formal action to adopt the UBTC within the City's corporate borders.

7. **Director's Responsibilities.** The Director of the MABCD shall provide for the administration and supervision of said code inspection and enforcement.

8. **City's Liaison.** The City shall appoint one person from the governing unit to serve as liaison to the MABCD for the purpose of achieving the aims and objectives of this Agreement.

9. **Prosecution of Violations.** In light of the fact that the City of Mulvane's corporate boundaries are located within both Sedgwick County and Sumner County, the County consents to the municipal court for the City serving as the sole court in which any violations will be prosecuted. Accordingly, the City retains the ultimate discretion as to whether or not to bring any charges and is responsible with designating appropriate employees to serve as authorized personnel to write and serve any such charges upon defendants. Furthermore, the City shall be entitled to any fines and court costs that may be received from such prosecutions free and clear of any claim by the County.

10. **Termination.** Either party to this Agreement shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon notice to the other as set forth hereinafter. Written notice of termination issued on lawful authority of the terminating party shall be given in writing 30 days prior to the effective date of termination.

11. **Hold Harmless.** The City shall indemnify the County, and its elected and appointed officials, officers, managers, members, employees and agents, against any and all loss or damage to the extent such loss and/or damage arises out of the City's negligence and/or willful, wanton or reckless conduct in the provision of goods and equipment or performance of services under this Agreement.

12. **Entire Agreement; Amendment.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto. No amendment, waiver or modification of this Agreement shall be effective unless reduced to writing and signed by the authorized officers of each of the parties hereto.

13. **Savings Clause.** In the event that any provision of this Agreement is held to be unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

14. **Effective Date; Prior Agreement.** This Agreement shall become effective upon signature of approval of both parties and upon compliance of City with the provisions in Paragraph 6, above, and shall continue in force and effect until terminated by either party as provided in Paragraph 10, above. Upon the approval of this Agreement, the parties' agreement dated February 23, 2011, and any other agreement(s) regarding building, mechanical, plumbing, and/or electrical code inspections, shall be superseded and terminated.

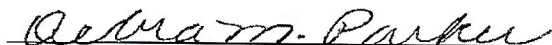

**SUBJECT: Certification of Final Costs; Public Hearing**  
**AGENDA: Action/Action**

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**Background**

The City Council, by previous action and at the request of 100% of benefited landowners, authorized the construction of certain (i) water, sanitary sewer, street and storm sewer improvements, and mass grading and detention pond improvements in Harvest Point by Resolution No. 2023-5 as amended by Resolution No. 2024-3; (ii) water, sanitary sewer, street, storm sewer improvements, and mass grading and pond improvements in Emerald Valley Estates 2<sup>nd</sup> Addition by Resolution No. 2024-4 (collectively, the “Improvements”). The Improvements have been completed and final costs and proposed assessments have been prepared for consideration and approval by the City Council. The next step of the financing process is to (a) approve the total final costs and proposed assessments for the improvements and (b) to call a public hearing to receive complaints or objections to the proposed special assessments.

The Certification of Final Costs has now been finalized and requires the Council’s formal acceptance.

**Financial Considerations:**

According to the petitions, the benefitted properties in the benefit district will be responsible for (i) 95% of the water improvements in Emerald Valley Estates 2<sup>nd</sup> Addition, and (ii) 100% of the costs associated with the remaining Improvements. Special Assessments will be levied against the benefitted properties following the holding of the required public hearing. Staff will be suggesting a 20-year special assessment period.

**Legal Considerations:**

The City Council must formally accept and approve the total final costs and proposed assessments of the improvements as presented and adopt a Resolution, setting the date, time, and place for a public hearing to receive objections or complaints to the proposed assessments against their property for the improvement. A Notice of Public Hearing will be published in the official city newspaper. In addition, individual notices will be mailed to the benefitting property owners of the hearing and proposed assessments. The City Council has the legal authority to take the action required.

**Recommendation:**

City Staff’s recommendation is for the City to (1) accept and approve the total final costs and proposed assessments of the Improvements as presented by the City Clerk, and then (2) approve the Resolution setting the date, time, and place for a public hearing.

**Sample Motions:**

1. I move we accept and approve the total final costs and proposed assessments for the Improvements.



2. I move to adopt Resolution No. 2026-2 setting the date, time, and place of the public hearing and providing for the publication of the notice of public hearing in the required newspaper and the mailing of the notice of public hearing to the property owners in the benefit district.
