Summary of Rules For Operating a UTV on Residential Streets

- 1. All UTVs must be licensed on or before July 1 for each year of operation. (The license plate must be visible on the Driver's side rear of the UTV.)
- 2. All UTVs must be insured at all times and evidence of insurance should be available to the operator while driving the UTV.
- 3. The operator and ALL PASSENGERS must wear a seat belt at all times.
- 4. Children who would be required to use a safety seat, child restraint, or booster seat in an automobile are NOT permitted to ride as a passenger in a UTV under any circumstances. (Generally, all passengers must be at least 9 years old, weigh more than 80 lbs., and be at least 4 ft. 9 in. tall.)
- 5. All UTV Operators must be at least 18 years old and have a valid Driver's License in their possession at all times while operating a UTV. (Children and teenagers without a Driver's License are NOT permitted to operate a ATV and UTV.)
- 6. The number of passengers in a UTV is limited to the passenger design of the UTV and may never exceed 4 persons (including the operator).
- 7. UTVs may not be operated upon any designated Kansas Highway or any other, street, road or alley with a posted speed limit in excess of 45 miles per hour. (For instance,UTVs may NOT be driven on or along K-15, or Main Street/K-53. An operator may cross such a street, but only at a 90 degree angle to get to the adjacent residential street.)
- 8. UTVs may not be driven after Sunset or during anytime at night unless equipped with lights (including brake light) at least similar to that of a motorcycle.
- 9. UTVs may NOT be driven on the sidewalk or bike paths.
- 10. UTV operators must follow ALL rules of the road. (*Drive only along the right side of the road and obey all signs, signals, and traffic control devices.*)
