MULVANE CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

August 5, 2019 7:30 p.m.

The Mulvane City Council convened at the City Building at 211 N. Second at 7:30 p.m. Presiding was Mayor Shelly Steadman, who called the meeting to order.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Utility Dept. – Review Bids for New Trucks:

The Utility Department requested bids from three (3) dealers for a 2020 Ford-350 XL 4WD Pickup truck and a 2020 Ford-450 XL 4WD Pickup truck. Bids were opened at the City Clerk's office on July 29, 2019. The only bid returned was from Rusty Eck Ford. Utility Director, Brad Modlin, explained the bid for the Sewer Dept. included a small hydraulic crane. Modlin is following up with the other vendors to inquire why they did not send in a bid.

The pickups scheduled for replacement are a 2003 Chevy 2500 and a 1995 Chevy 1500. These will be placed for auction on Purple Wave. The City has had good success using this vendor. The Council would like an update of the items sold on Purple Wave.

MOTION by Keck, second by Allen to approve the purchase of one 2020 F-350 XL 4WD Pickup from Rusty Eck Ford for the total amount of \$49,687.00 to be dispersed from water fund #512-13-616

MOTION approved unanimously.

MOTION by Fleming, second by Allen to approve the purchase of one 2020 F-450 4WD Pickup from Rusty Eck Ford for the total amount of \$69,509.00 to be dispersed from sewer fund #513-12-616.

MOTION approved unanimously.

2. School Supplies for Fines Program:

In a recent Court Newsletter, the City of Shawnee launched a very creative initiative allowing court defendants to resolve part of their fines by donating school supplies. Public Safety Director, Gordon Fell, asked the council to allow the City of Mulvane to offer this program during the month of August to help parents/students in the community.

Defendants bring in new school supplies, still in their original packaging, along with a receipt to show proof of purchase and the amount paid. The court will grant a credit towards their fines for double the amount paid for the school supplies, up to a maximum of \$20.00 of school supplies, which credits \$40.00 towards their fines. This opportunity is only available one time per defendant.

The amount that the city would lose is unknown due to the fact that we would not know how many people would participate in the program. Based on numbers from last year, the maximum amount the city would lose would be approximately \$3960.00.

Council suggested that the list of eligible supplies match the items for the Mulvane School District. Council would also like to be provided the results/outcome of this program.

MOTION by Fleming, second by Keck to approve School Supplies for Fines from August 1st to August 30th.

MOTION approved unanimously.

3. Fire Dept. – Grant Acceptance:

In January 2019 we were awarded \$5,418 from the Kansas State Fire Marshal for the purchase of 20 sets of Wildland Bunker Gear, at no cost. This Kansas Forestry Grant will allow us to equipment the other 20 members of the department in Wildland Gear. Wildland Bunker Gear is much lighter gear than our normal Structural Gear that is normally worn. Our goal is to take some of the wear and tear off the Structural Gear which costs about \$2,300 per set. A local Boy Scout, Hunter North, helped demonstrate the difference in the gear.

Kansas Forestry Service awarded Mulvane Fire Rescue a 50/50 matching grant to finish equipping our firefighters with Wildland Bunker Gear. As part of this grant, we also included 40 Wildland CarbonX hoods with N-95 particulate breathing filters for lung protection. We received four (4) quotes for this gear. The lowest bid for this equipment is from Feld Fire Equipment, Inc. in the amount of \$8,436.00 with the Kansas Forestry Service funding \$4,218.00.

MOTION by Keck, second by Fleming to accept the bid from Feld Fire Equipment in the amount of \$8,436.00 with \$4,218 being reimbursed by the grant, purchase to be made from the Fire Department New Equipment line item.

MOTION approved unanimously.

4. Purchase of a New Ambulance:

Public Safety Director, Gordon Fell, provided information to the council. The 2019 budget includes the replacement of Ambulance #451. Ambulance #451 is a 2009 Chevy E451, which is the oldest ambulance within the fleet. The City purchased at Ford Transit Type II Ambulance in 2018 and we have been pleased with the operation, maintenance and durability of the vehicle.

Bids were sought for a Ford Transit Type II Ambulance. We received two bids, with American Response Vehicle being the low bidder at \$129,804.00. The approximate delivery date is 150 days. ARV is the current ambulance vendor for Sedgwick County. Sedgwick County spoke highly of ARV business practices and cooperation as a vendor.

MOTION by Keck, second by Allen to accept the bid from ARV in the amount of \$129,804.00 for the purchase of a new ambulance. Purchase to be made from the EMS New Equipment line item.

MOTION approved unanimously.
